We are now at the exciting stage where some youngsters are really thinking about what it means to be a Christian. Many have told us that they pray when they are troubled or upset. We hope to encourage and support the children by introducing them to a variety of approaches in how to pray.

Pastoral Care Committee Report

The new Pastoral Care Committee first met on 24th March 2015. The Pastoral Roll was updated and committee members assigned to visit those members of the congregation on the new Roll. Committee members contributed information, currently known to them, regarding the needs of members on the Pastoral Care Roll. The needs of recently-bereaved members were discussed and it was agreed to give further thought and consideration to ways in which we might offer support. We also discussed how we might extend the support given by the Pastoral Care Committee, members being asked to consider this and suggest ideas at our next meeting, on 26th May.

On this date, committee members reported on the visits which had taken place since our last meeting. It was pleasing to note that visits had been very well received and greatly appreciated. Members displayed considerable interest in the life and work of St Margaret's church even though they were unfortunately unable to attend services.

Proposals for the future development of the Pastoral Care Committee were considered.

- One idea raised was to trial a "Playlist for Life" intervention with one family. This is basically creating a compilation CD of a dementia sufferer's favourite music. Research has shown that this can greatly enhance their life and their relationship with loved ones.
- Another idea put forward was to create a very practical service. We are calling it, **"Have Light bulb, Will Travel!"** This **bright** idea is intended to support members who need help with, e.g. climbing a ladder to change home light bulbs....or generally assist with small, essential tasks. The Minister has agreed with the idea in principle and we will endeavour to take this project forward in due course.

As you can see, a lot of thought and consideration has been given to this area of our Church's life and work. We seek to support those folks who are unable to attend church for a variety of reasons, and ensure they know that they matter and are valued members of our church family.

NEWS SNIPPETS FROM THE WORLD MISSION COUNCIL

The June/July edition features:

The Church of Scotland in the World: Ian Alexander invites you to embark on a faith journey with the world church. For the WMC today, it's about being friends. It is about the whole Church of Scotland, in Scotland and beyond, remembering that it is not just a small isolated entity on the outer reaches of Europe, but is an integral and active part of the worldwide church of Jesus Christ, working around the globe to share the good news.

Prayer Focus Twinning: Twinning is about friendship and partnership in a common cause – to deepen faith and mission among the people of God. It brings together people across great distances

and differences, both internationally and within Scotland. The Church of Scotland twinning programme has been running for 13 years now, and is growing stronger and stronger. Congregations and presbyteries are learning that by developing a twinning relationship with a partner church overseas, they can strengthen and deepen their own faith, as well as expanding their mission to the community in which they are placed in Scotland.

Freedom to the Prisoner: Pakistan Religious freedom and escape migration are hot topics in 2015, as people across the world are grappling with how to live harmoniously with people of different faiths and cultures. For Christians living in minority situations such as Pakistan this is an ever present reality.

Mucho blah blah: Cuba. Carol Finlay tells us about getting to know the people of the Presbyterian Reformed Church of Cuba

Twinning with Nigeria: United with Christ, in love, spirit and purpose. David Wishart tells us about Corsock and Kirkpatrick Durham Parish Church's recent twinning visit to Amarsari, Nigeria.

Sight to the Blind: Zambia In December 2013, Polwarth Parish Church began a two-year commitment to two projects in Zambia organised through their link with their Mission Partners at the UCZ University College in Zambia. The first was to raise awareness of the plight of Albinos in Zambia who face stigmatisation and discrimination, and who also suffer from the rigors of the sun, which leads to skin cancer and eye problems. The second project was to support a foster carer who acts as an advocate for the Albino Foundation in Zambia, but also fosters and cares for over 18 children in her home.
